Board of Equalization, 3rd District

President's Message



At our last meeting, guest speaker Dawn Wetzel, President, California Federation of Republican Women - Southern Division, was so interesting and inspiring. She encouraged everyone to be as active as possible and to always be on the lookout for new possible members wherever we are. By staying informed on things that are happening in our government, we can have an intelligent and persuasive conversation with women we meet. This can happen no matter where we are, even if it's just standing in line at the grocery store. Our Republican Women Federated is the largest grassroots women's organization in the nation - in existence for many years and growing by leaps and bounds. They keep us informed politically on a national and statewide level.



After our last meeting was officially adjourned, a group of our members stayed to discuss several vital issues pertaining to the concept of universal health care. Our Membership Co-Chair, Pam Goodherham, spoke of her personal experiences with universal health care while living in England, as well as that of her relatives. The way health care is handled there is absolutely frightening. Mr. Obama stated last week on national television that if we are going to have universal health care, "we might as well go all the way and have a system such as that in Europe." REMEMBERING THEIR VALOR, FIDELITY AND SACRIFICE - D-DAY 65TH ANNIVERSARY

In commemoration, we reprint the following excerpt from one of President Ronald Reagan's most memorable speeches delivered at Pointe Du Hoc, Normandy, France, on June 6, 1984 (the 40th anniversary of the D-Day):

"Why? Why did you do it? What impelled you to put aside the instinct for self-preservation and risk your lives to take these cliffs? What inspired all the men and the armies that met here? We look at you, and somehow we know the answer. It was faith, and belief; it was loyalty and love.

The men of Normandy had faith that what they were doing was right, faith that they fought for all humanity, faith that a just God would grant them mercy on this beachhead or on the next. It was the deep knowledge--and pray God we have not lost it...that there is a profound moral difference between the use of force for liberation and the use of force for conquest. You were here to liberate, not to conquer, and so you, and those others did not doubt your cause. And you were right not to doubt.

You all knew that some things are worth dying for, one's own country is worth dying for, and democracy is worth dying for, because it's the most honorable form of government ever devised by man. All of you loved liberty, all of you were willing to fight tyranny, and you knew the people of your countries were behind you."

OCFRW MAY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The featured keynote speaker at the OCFRW May 7th Meeting was OC Sheriff-Coroner Sandra Hutchens. She will soon be completing one year in office (June 10) and had 30 years of background experience in law enforcement with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department prior to accepting her current position. Sheriff Hutchens is absolutely amazed at the level of community involvement here in Orange County. She feels this is vital to our general safety – stressing the importance of being vigilant and calling whenever something doesn't seem right in our neighborhoods. There have been several occasions when a citizen has called the Sheriff's office stating, "I hate to bother you, but something doesn't seem right." This has lead several times to arrests or to stopping a crime in progress - so never be afraid to call!! This vigilance is what is helping to keep us all safe!

Orange County is the second largest County in the state and the fifth in the nation. The Sheriff's Department protects from the coastline and three miles out - then the Coast Guard takes over. They have this jurisdiction to help control alcoholism while boating, and of course, the ever present danger of a potential terrorist attack. They are proactive in constantly conducting drills within the department to handle large scale emergencies and terrorist attacks and their response to each.

Of interest is the fact that Orange County has the second largest jail population in the state. There are five facilities, and the jail population is over 75% felony convictions. A large population of mentally ill inmates does make things more difficult, but her deputies have special training to handle these special inmates.

The OC Sheriff's Dept. also has a cross designation program to handle and identify illegal aliens. Thus far, over 8,000 inmates have been identified and sent back to their home of origin. The reciditive rate for these immigrants is very low. Additionally, the search and rescue operation of her department is totally comprised of volunteers who are very dedicated and a great asset.

Overall, Sheriff Hutchens was very open and admitted that mistakes have been made, but that when they happen, they admit them and things are corrected.

"Define Conservatism – For Past, Present and Future Generations" written by Jonathan Krohn

MAY MESSAGE FROM STATE

SENATOR MIMI WALTERS, 33RD DISTRICT

Senator Walters Focused on Economy, Streamlining Government with Legislation

"May is a busy month in our State's Capitol Building. There are myriad legislative deadlines, and that means bills must either be moved through policy committees or they will die. Our efforts have been primarily focused on streamlining state laws, protecting hard working taxpayers, and providing stimulus for California's economy.

The first of these bills is Senate Bill 221 (SB 221), which repeals an out-dated provision involving a home-based dialysis program instituted by the federal government in the 1990s. The program never got off the ground and the home dialysis law in California was never removed from the Health & Safety or the Business & Professions Codes. Since that time, the home dialysis law has caused much confusion to health care providers as to whether or not they must comply with the obsolete law. SB 221 passed off the Senate Floor on April 23, 2009 with no opposition. The bill currently awaits a hearing in the Assembly Committee on Health.

The second bill is one that we have worked on for the past several years. Senate Bill 108 (SB 108) was originally introduced as Assembly Bill 1868 (AB 1868) in 2008, in order to protect California's charter schools from lawsuits, the same way our local public schools are protected under the California Tort Claims Act. Charter schools abruptly lost this protection when a California Appeals Court ruled that charter schools are not public entities for the purposes of the Tort Claims Act, even though almost all charter schools in California are operated by public school districts.

AB 1868 passed out of the Assembly in 2008, requesting a study to be conducted by the California Law Revision Commission. The study was designed to provide a general discussion of the differences between charter schools and district schools under the California Tort Claims Act. Unfortunately, AB 1868 was held in the Senate Education Committee. We have reintroduced this legislation as SB 108, which passed unanimously out of the Senate Judiciary Committee, and is awaiting a hearing in the Senate Appropriations Committee. We hope that SB 108 will continue to move forward through the Legislature in order to provide the protection originally intended and sorely needed for California's charter schools.

The final three pieces of legislation, Senate Bills 107, 373, and 658 were all featured in last month's newsletter. All three bills are scheduled to be heard in the Senate Revenue & Taxation Committee on Wednesday, May 13, 2009.

SB 107 will exempt nonprofit organizations from certain types of sales tax charges, such as mandatory gratuities, tips, or service fees that are charged to a nonprofit organization by hotels, caterers, restaurants, or similar establishments for meals, food, or beverages. SB 107 is an important measure to protect these charities' precious donations that help to provide the services that are so important to our community.

SB 373 will exempt buyers of new cars and motorcycles from the recently passed increase of the Vehicle License Fee (VLF). We hope to help stimulate the economy and help to preserve jobs with the passage of SB 373.

SB 658 will exempt new vehicle buyers from the sales tax that is normally assessed on the value of their trade-in when purchasing a new vehicle. Vehicle purchases are already double-taxed, and with the car tax and sales tax increases, SB 658 is designed to protect California's taxpayers as well as stimulating our State's moribund economy.

Our efforts will continue to be focused on making government smaller, more efficient, and more responsive, with fewer laws, lower taxes, and less regulation."

MICHELLE STEEL: CAL. STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION LAUNCHES NEW WEBSITE

Michelle Steel, Third District Member of the State Board of Equalization (BOE), today unveiled a redesigned website, www.boe.ca.gov, which focuses on customer service, making information easy to access and use. With many online state tax and fee programs and services available, customers are increasingly interacting with the BOE through the Internet. The BOE is building upon this strong foundation by making this strategic investment to meet growing public expectations for access to services and information 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Specifically, the new website:

- Integrates information related to five major programs – property taxes, sales & use taxes, excise taxes, environmental fees, and fuel taxes.
- Provides easy-to-use, task-driven "How do I...?" links to help customers quickly find what they need.
- Features a new knowledge finder search tool, which will enable visitors to search for specific tax programs and services using key words.
- Achieves consolidation of FAQ pages, glossary tools, and research data and trends.
- Improves access to help customers understand tax issues, rules and regulations, and law guides. And,
- Streams real-time Board of Equalization meetings. Californians can also efile returns and pay their taxes online.
